Helen Tennison

Helen is an Edinburgh Fringe First Award-winning director, writer and theatre maker. Her work spans new writing, classics, devised and site-responsive theatre. Recent projects include writing and directing *Navigating Margaret*, a story of living with dementia (performed by professional, emerging, community and child actors); directing *Forgive Me*, a devised show about autism (premiered at The Lowry); an audio walk on building sustainable city communities; directing for Vienna's English Theatre; directing a site-specific 1980's *Much Ado* for Creation Theatre. Other experience includes work for Arcola Theatre, Oxford Playhouse, Shakespeare's Globe, Belgrade Theatre and Guildford's Yvonne Arnaud. She was Artist in Residence at the University of South Florida, and Associate Artist at Bathway Theatre, University of Greenwich. She is currently developing her award nominated lecture-performance, *Doggerland*.

Martin Edwards

Martin was formerly a journalist for local newspapers and then the BBC. He then trained as an actor at the Oxford School of Drama and later ALRA. As an actor he is OFFIE-nominated, and has performed at various venues including Soho Theatre and Southwark Playhouse.
