Rena Brannan

She is a member of the Critical Mass Programme at The Royal Court, was a founding member of the Arcola's Middle Eastern, Asian and North African writers programme, and is a member of the Arcola Theatre's writer's workshop. Productions of her plays include *The Cu\*ts* (Arcola 2nd Playwrought Festival, 2014); *Mount Vernon* (Hollywood Fringe Festival, 2016 and King's Head Theatre, 2018); *The History of Two Lovers* (residency at the Arcola Lab in November 2018, and 2022 at the ARTS theatre); *Shutters: A Lesbian Rock Opera* (Omnibus Theatre, June 2023); *Ginzel's Little Cordoba* (Edinburgh Fringe, 2023 and London Crossrail Amphitheatre, 2024); and a commissioned monologue, *Artefact*, as part 1 of *A Double Bill of Forbidden Love* (Playground Theatre, 2023).
