Sue Healy

Irish playwright Sue Healy is Literary Manager at the Finborough Theatre, an Associate Lecturer in Playwriting at the universities of Lincoln and Portsmouth, and tutor of Creative Writing at CityLit. Her play *Imaginationship* had a sold-out, extended run at the Finborough in 2018, later showing at the Stephen Joseph in Scarborough. Previous productions inclue *Cow* (Etcetera) and *Brazen* (King's Head), funded by Arts Council England. Her short work has been performed at the Arcola (Minaturists), Criterion, Hackney Attic, Claremorris Festival (New Writing Award winner), Brighton Festival (Sussex Playwrights' Award Winner) and Sterts Theatre, and has been developed by the Abbey Theatre, Dublin. Radio work includes nine plays broadcast on BBC Radio 4 (Opening Lines winner), WLR fm and KCLR96fm. Sue has a doctorate in modern theatre history (specialising in the Royal Court Theatre), and is a UEA Creative Writing MA alumna.

Georgie Bailey

Georgie is a poet, playwright, performer and digital producer. He is the current literary projects manager for the London Playwrights Blog, and a co-founder and Artistic Director of ChewBoy Productions (a multi-arts company dedicated to fostering emerging artists). In 2018 he had two full-length pieces, *Drag Me Out* (Hen and Chickens) and *Euam* (Tristan Bates Theatre) produced in London to five and four star acclaim. An alumnus of Soho Theatre's Writers Lab, HighTide's Writers Group and a current member of Papatango's South East Development Scheme, Georgie has also had numerous shorter pieces staged at showcases in regional and London venues. He works full-time for Chichester Festival Theatre, where he has led several creative writing projects with young people, as well as developing plays through script consultancy work.
